#### **OPEN HOUSE**

During the March Regular Membership Meeting a proposal was placed before the members present for the Civic Center to be open to the public three mornings a week. The days were to be Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. **Dan Morrell** told the members that he would organize it and be there on those days to welcome whoever might show up. After discussion involving the cost of this proposal, including heat, electricity, water, maintenance, etc, and another proposal to have it open only one day a week instead of three, the majority of the members present decided to disregard the costs involved and go with the proposal as presented.

The main underlying reasons for this project was to attract new people to the building to meet and hopefully persuade them to join our club, and second, we wanted to provide another place where citizens could just drop in and "shoot the bull", and perhaps get a bite to eat, such as donuts, or a minor breakfast.

Although during the first several weeks we were sometimes getting 6 to 16 people coming in to "shoot the bull", the overwhelming majority of those "bull shooters" were our own members. According to our President, one time there were 15 members and only one citizen guest present, which happened to be her Husband. We did manage to sign him up during the "Open House" event, so we made a plus out of that. In addition, coupled with some donuts, etc, provided by Dan, and some donations coming in through the door, we did manage to break even on the food and drink, so that was another plus.

Hopefully, as this Open House idea continues, it will become totally cost effective, as a result of the many new members we will be signing up. It wasn't going to be open during the Summer, but will now operate one day a week, per our President. Sometimes new ideas take some time to catch on and produce the results we are looking for. We're sure those involved will continue to give it their best shot.

#### PARKING LOT SPACES FOR RENT

We have made note of this in a prior newsletter but it's worth mentioning again. Anyone can rent spaces in the Civic Center Parking Lot. 10X10 Spaces rent for \$15.00 each day, and 10X20 Spaces rent for \$25.00 each day. These spaces are only available if the main hall is not rented. Those who rent our building come first, even if they rent the building after you have reserved a space in the parking lot. So...there is a small risk to you. But, we rent the hall about 30% of the year, so that makes the lot available most of the remaining year.

We have rented spaces in the lot many times to local vendors, some within our own club. It's a good location for the vendors and the cost to them is minimal. This policy allows us to still make some extra revenue when our building is not rented. All but the rented space/s would still be available to the public for parking. Everybody wins.

So.... spread the word. Perhaps you have some "Yard Sale" type items you would like to get rid of, or a lot of garden produce you could sell, etc. Give our Booking Agent a call at 639-4621 and reserve a space today. 
#### CIVIC CLUB BAKE SALE

Our Bake Sale was held on the levee during the 'Junk in the Trunk' sale from 10 AM to 4 PM on Saturday, May 3rd. Our efforts netted us about \$107.40. Many delicious home made baked goods were sold quickly to those who lined up early. Thanks to all who made and donated the baked items, and the members who worked the stand.

### BOAT DISASTER RENTAL REVENUE ARRIVED!



Our Treasurer reported at the April General Membership Meeting that she had received the Rental Fees incurred by the Tug Boat operation, Marquette Transportation. Back in November of 2013, one of their big tow boats was sinking and they tied it up directly in the rear of our building. It took many days of on site work to get it repaired. During that time period, they used our facility as their headquarters and for their crews to warm up, 24 hours a day. The total bill which was estimated at \$2000, came to \$1,875.00. It was extra revenue we had not counted on in our overall budget for 2013. It was put to very good use.

# Regular Meetings Now Feature Guest Speakers

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This year we have been inviting guest speakers to our Regular General Membership Meetings to speak on subjects our members might be interested in. The members seem to have enjoyed the speakers and their topics. So far the subjects have been well presented and received.

The first one was a short talk on <u>Local and Regional History</u> at our March Meeting. **Bob Schifke**, <u>Executive Director</u> of the **Buffalo Bill Museum**, shared some interesting information and pictures of some of the local and Scott County early settlers. He also updated our members on the new museum expansion. A couple of our members shared some knowledge they had about a picture of early settlers he brought with him.

The second subject was covered during our April Meeting. It was a presentation on Concealed or not Concealed Gun Carrying Permits and how to get one. One of our members, Chris Cournoyer, is a certified instructor on this subject. She assisted another certified instructor, Darin Oberhart, as he gave a talk which covered the changes to the permit regulation involving Senate File #2379 and the Sheriff's Department's diminished involvement. The Sheriff used to screen the applicants for a permit to carry a concealed gun, but now our legislators took that discretionary decision away from them. Although there are a few requirements that must be met, now, almost anyone can get a permit. So, the bad guys better watch out, 'cause who knows who might have a gun or a big knife under their coat, or who doesn't. No one knows , including the police. But then, it is the American way.... Second Amendment, etc. If you have any questions about required training courses, etc. to qualify for the permit, we suggest you contact a Law Enforcement Agency, or call Chris at 505-6703.

At the May meeting, **Dan Musak** of **Musak Plants**, presented a detailed program on different types of **Hostas and Growing Impressive Gardens**. He is a Master Gardener. His talk included a slide show which gave us examples of a multitude of various Hosta beds, diseases and how to control them, flowers, his personal gardens, etc. The talk was very informative and he answered many questions afterwards about not only hostas, but also flowers, animal control, splitting and replanting bulbs, etc.

There wasn't any program at the June Meeting. There is a program scheduled for the July Meeting. In the near future one of our Civic Club Members will present a slide show showcasing her family trip to Austria. It should be very interesting.



About every three to five years the board reviews our present Insurance Policy and requests new bids from local insurance companies or agents, for our insurance needs. At an earlier meeting this year, the members told the Officers and Board what basic coverage they would like to see in a policy. These included some things like flood insurance, earthquake insurance, and up to date replacement cost. They naturally wanted the policy to be cost effective for us too. Other than those considerations, they gave the Board the power to accept a bid that included those basic items.

This year we had three submittals. After much discussion by the Board, they accepted the low bid from **Allied Insurance** at about \$1,294 a year. The coverage was a little better than our previous policy with lowa Mutual. We have more coverage for personal property such as stove, refrigerators, tables & chairs, etc. Our deductible is the same as before. Our Insurance Agent's name is **Barry Waldron**. It will be ip for review again sometime between 2016 and 2018.
