The day before the event, the hall & kitchen floors were mopped & cleaned by Ron Leiby, and all tables & chairs were set up by Ron & Wes Kuehl. In addition, Joyce Kuehl picked up all the fixings for the spaghetti & meatballs, etc. and delivered them to the hall. If I left someone out... I am very sorry. So, all in all, it took about 15-20 members to ensure that our first Spaghetti Dinner Fund Raiser was successful.

THE LECLAIRE CIVIC CENTER HISTORY & PAST PICTURES

The **LeClaire Civic Center** used to be old Kitchen's Corner. The stone structure was originally built in the 1930s by **Captain Frank Kitchen**, a former river man. He lived in a single second story room (there used to be a building with an entire second floor on that sight, see picture to the right) In the lower level there was a tavern, a gas / service station, and a restaurant.

In 1958, the building had been vacant for about five years and in very poor shape. Some LeClaire Civic Club volunteers got together to see if it could be renovated for use as a community center. Frank Schurr, a member of the Civic Club at the time, decided to purchase the building and sell it to the Civic Club. They paid him back over a period of many years, using the proceeds from the old "RIVERESTA" summer celebration event that was sponsored by the Civic Club.


The entire community of LeClaire was behind the renovation and many volunteers stepped forward to help. A lot of the materials were provided "at cost" by local merchants. The **1960** Civic Club President, **Don Youngers**, gave a report at a regular meeting stating that the building renovations were coming along just fine and that with the continued help of some more volunteers, they might be able to finish the job by Winter.

The complete renovation was accomplished in the early 1960s and opened to the public. It was owned by the Civic Club and operated by them, along with the Civic Club Auxiliary. The Auxiliary was very instrumental in raising funds for things such as tables & chairs, kitchen appliances and equipment, interior decorations, etc. In 1999, the two civic groups were combined into the Civic Club.


The LeClaire Civic Center has proved to be a big asset to the community over the last 57 years of operation. We have every intention of continuing operations well into the future. Thousands of hours of hard work from hundreds of volunteers over the years have made this center what it is. We have all worked together to keep the original dream alive, which is an example of the saying "Through Teamwork, The Dream Works" Thanks to those handful of dreamers, and Frank Schurr, back in 1958, who looked at a run down, completely dilapidated, vacant building, and thought to themselves that with a little hard work, this building could be saved and converted into a very useful and much needed community center.

A side note... Most know this but some of you don't... If you look at the face of the stone fire place, in the main hall, you can still see the "K" in the stone. It stood for Kitchen's corner. The past is always there to remind us that the original volunteers are watching us..... hoping that their dream stays alive.

PARKING LOT USE

The Board recommended and the members present at the June Regular Membership Meeting agreed to make portions of our parking lot available for rent if the building was not rented for the same time period. So, now a vendor can rent a 10 X 10 foot space for \$15.00 or a 10 X 20 foot space for \$25.00 a day. The vendor would have to call our Booking Agent, Vicky Haynes, no more than a week ahead of the time they would like to use the space... and if the building was not rented for that time period, the vendor would be allowed to set up. Of course, a regular Civic Center building renter, who would expect the parking lot would be available for them, would take preference.

We have had vendors, every now and then, ask to use a portion of our lot. This would give us another source of revenue, and set a standard fee for its use by vendors or citizens. The board is always looking for ways to increase revenue that could be used for the maintenance of our property and to help cover administrative costs.

If any of you can suggest ways for us to save money, or increase revenue, without raising the basic rental cost of our building, please share your ideas with our Board. They are open to new ideas.




