

Recently, the *LeClaire Civic Club's* membership voted to establish an Emergency Assistance Fund for low income residents in the greater LeClaire area whose immediate needs are not fully met through local food banks, clothing closets, or individual churches. It will be organized and implemented through the "*Christmas in LeClaire*" subcommittee of the Civic Club. They will insure that all funds received for the project will directly assist the individual or family in need.

Rather than duplicate the work of other organizations, the "Christmas in LeClaire" committee has established an informal agreement with **PPALS** (a consortium of local churches) and other churches, which will be the "primary" source of referrals, providing initial screening and verification of need and maintaining the confidentially of the recipient. Their referral sources include the LeClaire Police Department, area schools, and direct requests for assistance.

Does the need exist? The Civic Club thought so, but were overwhelmed by the support we recently received from local businesses when we announced the project during a LeClaire Marketing Alliance meeting.

The November "Trivia Night Games" proceeds which amounted to about \$ 950.00 were designated for this Emergency Assistance Fund.

The Civic Club's regular Financial Audit will include the review of this Fund Account. Our members noted, when we initially considered this project, that it is exactly the sort of thing the Civic Club Mission Statement promotes, as does our non-profit status which states "<u>operated</u> <u>exclusively for the promotion of social welfare</u>" with our primary activities "<u>engaged in promoting in some way the common good and general</u> welfare of the community."

AUSTRIA !

At our August General Membership Meeting, A very interesting short program on Austria was presented by **Linda Hatcher**. Her Husband Dwayne works for John Deere. His company sent him to Austria in his

capacity as an engineer, and Linda went with him. While he worked, she was able to spend a lot of time experiencing the charm and beauty of that country. He couldn't join her in presenting her program during our meeting because his employer had sent him to Vietnam on another project.

Linda told us that she found the people of Austria to be "tight lipped" and pretty much stuck to their own group of friends and family. Their language is German...but they prefer not to be called Germans. They are Austrians, & proud of it! Their country is considered neutral and there are nine "states" within its borders. Basic things which we take for granted are somewhat different in Austria, such as; Gas is very expensive and sold by the liter. Compared to the U.S., a Gallon would cost about \$6.50 to \$7.00. (Ouch!) As a result, many of them either walk or ride a scooter to save money. Vehicles must be inspected once a year. No "junkers" are allowed on the road. Beer is very cheap and costs less than Pop. The work week is only 38 1/2 hours long. The government provides Health Care for everyone and a Pension when they retire from any work related job. Although the Winter there is about the same as our Winters, it's against the law to not have chains on the tires of your vehicle. Children are taught to ski beginning at about 2-3 years old. All children are taught English along with the German language. There is no speed limit on the Autobahn, which is something like our interstate highway.

Linda told us that during their time there, after a few mishaps and misunderstandings, they learned enough of the language to get by with a basic understanding of some words. Linda had a very interesting display of many items she brought back with her. She also showed us many slides of the country. Some questions were asked involving the exchange of money and the value of certain items. All in all, everyone thoroughly enjoyed her presentation. She was given a round of applause and thanked by all.


LeCLAIRE CIVIC CENTER KITCHEN TO BE RENOVATED

RENT A SPACE IN OUR PARKING LOT

We have made note of this in a prior newsletter but it's worth mentioning again. Anyone can rent spaces in the **Civic Center Parking Lot. 10X10 Spaces rent for \$15.00 each day, and 10X20 Spaces rent for \$25.00 each day.** These spaces are only available if the main hall is not rented. Those who rent our building come first, even if they rent the building after you have reserved a space in the parking lot. So...there is a small risk to you. But, we rent the hall about 30% of the year, so that makes the lot available most of the remaining year.

We have rented spaces in the lot many times to local vendors, some within our own club. It's a good location for the vendors and the cost to them is minimal. This policy allows us to still make some extra revenue when our building is not rented. All but the rented space/s would still be available to the public for parking. Everybody wins.




Also... In addition to the Paid Up Member Progressive Pot, somebody attending each meeting will always wins \$5, Member or Guest.


2014 TUG-FEST BINGO LeCLAIRE, IOWA AUGUST 7 - 9



VIDEO HISTORY VOLUNTEERS




